Layouts

Bad Obing (O) Chris Peters

A country terminus in southern Germany, set in the early 1960s with DCC sound and working signals

Bahnbetriebswerk Dügelshausen (H0) Doug Tompkins

A small locoshed located in the northern part of the BRD, near the inner-German border and set between 1979 and 1984, this compact layout shows what is achievable in a small space.

Catford Vermont (H0) and Köln Beutelmieze (H0) Andrew Knights

Variations on a micro-layout theme, built to show what is possible using limited space (each layout is just 3'3" x 1'), time and funds, whilst retaining operational interest and fun!

Clara Zetkin Stadt (H0) Tony Dean

A glimpse through 'The Wall' into the former East Germany (DDR) during the 1950s & 1960s.

Höchstädt (O) Bill Bishop

Höchstädt is set in the Fränkische Schweiz area of Bavaria during the summer of 1960.

Kanjiyama (N) Nick Harling

A Japanese Railways terminus, set in the mountainous Yamanashi prefecture during the late-1980s

Little Hister (O) Chris Pye

Little Hister represents an O Gauge Southern Region (LSWR) branch line terminus located on the South Coast of England. The period is set in the late 40's early 50's.

Rhineside (TT) David Harris

Based on an actual location, the double-track line running along the west bank of the river Rhine, in the gorge south of Koblenz, by the 'Loreley' in the 1994-2004 period.

South Bohemia (TTe) Blair Hobson

Czech 760mm gauge, using Z gauge track in the 1:120 (TT) scale allowing a view of a railway in the scenery.

Starker Verkehr (H0) Steve Grantham

A modern, post-privatisation small freight yard, set just outside Aachen around the year 2000 (Epoch V)

Stromallee (TT) Richard Self

Set in the former East Germany, Stromallee comprises an electrified mainline with passing loop, feeding a small selection of industries around the turn of the century.

Wolpertinger Hbf (N) Paul Smith

A slice of Bavaria, Epoch V/VI, featuring a 7-platform station, loco servicing depot and a small S-Bahn stabling yard.

Zevendaal (H0) Tom Nicholls

Fictitiously based in the Overijssel region of the Netherlands and inspired by the rail yards and docks of Zutphen and Deventer, allowing plenty of variety of freight and loads.
